Notrump Contracts


Develop a plan

- Count winners
- Look for additional tricks
- Analyze the opening lead.
- Which card do you play at trick one?
- Will you use a holdup play?
- Which suit do you attack first?
- What is the best way to play the suit you attack?

Example 1 – Holdup Play (3NT by South – Opening lead is the 5 of spades)



The opening lead is the $\bigstar 5$.





Example 1 – Holdup Play

What to play at trick one?



The best play on the opening lead is the ♠Q. If the Q holds you have 9 tricks.

However East covers with the K.

Now what?




Example 1 – Holdup Play

Holdup spades until trick 3 - Which suit do you attack?

<u>North</u> ♠ Q2	Holdup spades until trick 3.
 ✓ J74 ◆ AK3 ♣ 96532 	West is the dangerous opponent.
	If you try to establish clubs you will be set if West has a club entry or the A of hearts.
<u>South</u> ♠ A94 ♥ K10 ♦ QJ1054 ♣ AK7	The best hope is to play East for the A of hearts.


9 tricks – contract made

Assume East has overcalled 1♠ and West leads the ♠ 10.



The opening lead is the $\bigstar 2$.



Example 3 – Holdup Play

Don't holdup - attack diamonds

<u>East</u>

VQJ108

\$ 95

Don't hold up. Win the ♠A at trick one. A heart switch will defeat you.

You have 7 top tricks. You need to win two diamonds.

Lead a club to the South hand and finesse the **10** of diamonds.



Example 4 – Avoidance Finesse

(3NT by South – Opening lead is the 5 of spades)



The opening lead is the ♠5.

East covers the Q with the K.



Example 5 – Avoidance Duck (3NT by South – Opening lead is the 6 of spades)



The opening lead is the $\clubsuit 6$.

You play the Q and it holds.





Example 5 – Avoidance Duck

How do you attack diamonds?





This time East is the dangerous opponent.


We want to develop diamonds keeping East off lead.

Come to the South hand in hearts and lead a diamond to the K.

Once again, come to the South hand, lead a diamond and duck when West plays the Q.




(3NT by South – Opening lead is the 4 of spades)




The opening lead is the $\bigstar 4$.

You win East's J with the Q.




Example 6 – Establishing Two Suits

(3NT by South – Opening lead is the 4 of spades)



You have 6 top tricks. You need three more.

Two of the additional tricks will come from clubs, and the other from diamonds.

The correct play is to go after *clubs* first.

After driving out the A of clubs, holdup in spades until the third round when West continues the suit.

Develop diamonds keeping the dangerous opponent West off lead.
