# **Takeout Doubles**

Why do we make takeout doubles? The Philosophy....

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Originally, double was penalty. If we held AKx AKx AKx AKx We'd double a 1 sopening to say they couldn't make it; however the frequency is low.

Almost universally today, double means: "we want to compete in the auction and/or we have to many values to do anything else"

When it comes to doubles, when in doubt, double is takeout. Too many situations come up undiscussed to know everything. As situations arise we can make agreements to cover frequent auctions.

This double by partner could also consist of a strong hand and long suit of their own which they plan to rebid.

### **RESPONDING TO PARTNER'S DOUBLE**

| SOUTH | WEST | NORTH | EAST |

Minimum (0-6) hand bid a suit as cheaply as possible, it leaves more room. Lean towards bidding a major before a minor.

Medium (7-10) this is the most difficult range, we want to show a little life but will frequently make the same bid as a minimum.

Invitational (10-12) we make a jump bid or cuebid with the majors, this lets partner know we are interested in game.

Game Force (13+) we cuebid and see what happens from there. It's forcing to suit agreement.

When we have good cards in the opponent's suit we will consider pass ★KX ♥QXX ♦QJT9X ★KXX Keep in mind the vulnerability. What will give us the best score?
