From the Editors

We are excited to have the opportunity to send out the Unit 174 Newsletter. We have worked together for several years, identifying information that from the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin* that may be useful, especially to I/N players. The last two years of these monthly summaries are available here, on the WBA website.

Building on **Carol Wilson's** excellent work on this newsletter, we are going to add two new regular features. We will identify what we think is the best article in the ACBL *Bridge Bulletin* each month. We will also provide a "bridge tip" to help enhance your game. And we may include other news about bridge, our Unit, or Unit 174 members.

Bridge Bulletin ARTICLE OF THE MONTH

There are two articles of the month this month; one from the March *Bulletin* and one from the April *Bulletin*. **August Boehm**'s article, "C is for cover or not to cover," (March, 2018, p. 54) is a must-read and must-save. In one page he hits all the key points on this topic.

In the April *Bulletin*, **Pat Harrington**'s article (p. 46) points out that rebidding a suit partner has not supported tends to show a six-card suit. This idea is reinforced in the first problem in the "The Bidding Box" (p. 37) and in the first problem in "It's Your Call" (p. 40).

BRIDGE TIP

Counting high card points is a good way to get started when you're evaluating a hand, just like training wheels are a good way to get started when you're learning to ride a bike. But after a period of time, you need to progress beyond that if you're going to increase your skill. So, consider these points (pun intended) when evaluating a hand:

- 1. Aces are worth more than four; kings are worth a bit more than three; queens are worth less than two; and, jacks are worth less than one. Going back to the 1950s, Charles Goren added a point when he had all four aces. It's generally conservative to count an ace as 4.25 points.
- 2. Aces are especially valuable in suit contracts.
- 3. Subtract a point for a hand with no aces.
- 4. Honors together are worth more than honors by themselves. KQxx is worth more than Kxx and Qxx in different suits. KQJx is worth a lot more than Kxx, Qxx, and Jxx in three different suits. A queen with an ace is worth a lot more than an unsupported queen.
- 5. Honors in long suits are worth more than honors in short suits. Most realize a seven- card suit headed by the AKQ is something to get excited about. A seven-card suit headed by the ten with Ax, Kx and Qx in the other three suits is not something to get excited about.
- 6. When you have a five-card or longer suit, you can sometimes count a point for each card past the fourth card in the suit. It depends on how likely you think you are to take tricks with those long cards. Good declarers try to set up long suits. A fifth card in a suit is usually better than an unsupported jack.
- 7. When you are bidding a suit (as opposed to no trump) and you have no shortness (4-3-3-3), subtract a point for poor distribution,
- 8. Tens are worthwhile when they are in a suit where you have other honor(s). We don't count unsupported tens. Good intermediates are sometimes helpful.

TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

At the March Spindletop Sectional in Beaumont, **Judy and Ron Brown** topped the Masterpoint Winners List with 16.17 Masterpoints. They were first overall in two sessions – one with a 70.77% game – and scratched in three other sessions. Well done!
