### Why Is Our Beloved Game Called "Bridge"?



Would you believe *nobody knows*? A few hours' research yielded no answer. We know the game started as Whist by the Brits in the early 1500s. We find that a game called Russian Whist was also known as *biritch* or *britch*, whose meaning has nothing to do with a card game. Nevertheless, many think the British started using the word "bridge" at some time to refer to the card game, and it may have come from Russia. Etymologists tell us that the word "bridge" in reference to the card game

has nothing to do with any of the traditional meanings of the word. Go figure. Bridge was first played in the U.S. in 1890. We know that **Harold Vanderbilt** invented Contract Bridge in 1925, while on a cruise (but not on the captain's "bridge"), but by then the game was already called "Bridge" by all who played it.
