Apple Duplicate Bridge Clubs at Tracy Gee Community Center will host the ABA/ACBL Pairs Championship Game on Saturday, April 7, at 10 a.m.. **Brigitte Sandifer** reports that the entry fee is only \$5 for this Unit-sponsored event.

Bridge Club of Houston www.bridgeclubofhouston.com, holds a daytime Mentor/Mentee game on the first Thursday of each month and a night game on the third Monday of each month. Upcoming games are Monday night, 3/19; Thursday, 4/5; Monday, 4/16; and Thursday, 5/3. These are great opportunities for novice players to "play up" and get free pointers. On Saturday, 4/14, they will host a party for Evita Rduch's attaining Life Master and Julie Halperin's reaching Sapphire Life Master. Always great food at this exciting club! They also have a really fun game on the calendar once a month, usually the 4th Thursday: "8 Is Enough," a Swiss Team game. The rules of this competition assign A players 3 points, B players 2 points, and C players 1 point, and as long as a team has no more than 8 points, it qualifies. So 2 A players and 2 C players would be 8, 4 B players would be 8, 2 Bs and 2Cs would be 6, etc. If you haven't tried "8 Is Enough," make it a point to do so.

Clear Lake Bridge Club has lowered the game fees to \$5 for members and \$6 for non-members. (Membership costs only \$20 a year, so join up now!) Those fees include free coffee and snacks, and the club holds games seven days a week. On Monday through Thursday they have two games a day.
