Computer Guy: Doug Boswell

Doug Boswell has been playing bridge for over 50 years. He guesses about 25 years playing party bridge and 25 playing duplicate bridge.

He was raised in St. Louis, Missouri and went to college in Kansas City where he was originally a mathematics major. He eventually graduated with a degree in social sciences and a minor in business. He joined McDonnel Douglas after graduating and moved to Denver where he worked as a programmer mainly using COBOL.

After a few years of programming, Doug found it to be boring so he changed to a position doing sales support. He soon realized that role was a lot of work and the remuneration was small compared to the sales personnel. It was the sales personnel making the "big bucks" so he switched to sales where he spent the rest of his career.

Doug left McDonnel Douglas to head an office of a start-up company and eventually moved to the Ft. Worth area even though he said he'd never live in Texas.

After the move to Ft. Worth, Doug joined ACBL in 1996 and started playing at the Ft. Worth Bridge Studio but due to work constraints, he was only able to play once a week.

In 1999 a position opened in the Houston area with IBM so Doug moved south and started playing at the Clear Lake Bridge Club with (now) long-time partner Rodney McCullough. Turns out that Rodney and he had a Ft. Worth partner in common although they had never met each other while both were living in Ft. Worth.

Doug and Rodney amassed most of their masterpoints playing at tournaments so by the time Doug had 200 total masterpoints, he had earned the required pigmented points for his life master. So, it was just a matter of earning any points.

He became a Life Master in 2006 and in the summer of 2022, he achieved his Silver Life Master.



Doug now lives on the north side of Houston where he is a member of the Lone Star Bridge Club (LSBC). He previously served on that club's board and today he's their "computer" guy. He publishes their weekly club newsletter, he is the club's webmaster (https://lonestarbridgeclub.org) and he is often found assisting the club's directors to set up games. In addition to those activities, he is also a dealer.

When not playing bridge and doing all of the LSBC volunteer work, he and his wife Carrie are Class A motor homers. They have traveled coast to coast and made many friends along the way.

Doug has also restored/rebuilt a few antique cars: Model A and Original GT Mustang.

Doug and Carrie have four children, 10 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

Another example would be to have three Level 2 and one Level 1 player. That adds up to 7 and it is OK to be less than 8.





A Useful & Alertable 3NT Bid

A Useful and Alertable 3NT bid after partner opens 1 of a major. The 3NT bid shows exactly 3 of partner's major and no void, singleton or doubleton and 13-15 points. This bid well defines responders hand. Usually opener will leave the 3NT bid in with a flattish hand or return to play four of the major with a shapely hand. Occasionally, opener will have a big hand and explore for slam.

The value of this bid is when the same number of tricks can be made in

notrump as the major, leading to a good matchpoint board. However, sometimes, opener will think it is easier to score 9 tricks than 10 at IMPS.

I originally heard this bid as being called a Jacoby 3NT bid. I've also heard it referred to as a Bergen 3NT bid.




After West's pass, North opens 1♠. East passes and South bids 3NT. The alertable bid describes the hand perfectly: 13 - 15 HCPs, three of partner's suit and a balanced hand.


West passes and North bids $4 \spadesuit$. With a diamond void and a minimal opener, it is an easy $4 \spadesuit$ bid.

All pass.

East finds the killing lead of the ♣A. Usually leading unsupported aces is a poor lead, but not with this hand. The ♣4 is played from the North hand. As declarer, it is best to play a low card when you want the defense to switch suits.



East is not deterred by the low card played by North so plays another club, giving West a club ruff.



However, the \triangle A is East's only entry and West only has one spade left. So, the defense only gets one more trick (\triangle A).

Marty Bergen says voids are magical. North's diamond void saved the day.

How it works:

- It's a robot tournament. But the robots bid and play much faster than they normally do.

- It lasts for 25 minutes. You get to play as many hands as you can in 25 minutes. When the 25 minutes are up, the tournament is over. You don't get to finish the hand you're playing.
- The rankings are based on total net points scored.
- If your robot partner wins the bid. It declares. This is not necessarily a bad thing as the robot will declare faster than you will.
- You are promised the best hand at the table

BBO allows 40 people in the tournament. They seem to always fill up.

I scored 5190 points playing 20 boards, which was good for 9th. There were no makeable slams in my 20 boards.

Some basic strategy:

- Pass out all marginal openings. Time is precious, you don't want to waste it on partials.
- Forget overtricks, and claim ASAP. You want to get on to the next board.
- Unless they're doubled or vulnerable, once you got them set, play as fast as possible. Don't spend the time to try to get them a second undertrick.
- Bid close games. Spend a little extra time to make them.
- Try to have no interruptions as the clock never stops

Useful Obscure Bids - Part II

BY THOMAS RUSH This article is the second in a series covering bids that don't come up often, but when do occur, they can help you get to the right spot that would be difficult otherwise. The first article covered jumping in the suit that right hand opponent opened (e.g.: 1 - 3, or 1 - 3) and how the meaning of your jump is very different depending on whether one of a minor or one of a major was the opening bid!

In Part II, we'll cover a couple of No Trump bids that both involve balancing actions:

- 1. Opponents open one of a suit, you jump to 2NT in the balancing seat:
 - 1♦ Pass Pass 2NT
- 2. A NT rebid by opener after an auction like:

```
1♣ Pass Pass 1♥ or 1♥ Pass Pass DBL 1NT 1NT
```

Let's look at case 1. If you and your partner have a somewhat standard agreement, you might have a balancing 1NT bid show something like 11-15 HCP, and giving a structure like this in the balancing seat:

```
11-15 HCP 1NT balancing overcall
16-18 HCP Double, then bid NT at the lowest level
```

and that leaves you to come up with a bid to show the uncommon, but important 19-20-point hands (yes, they do come up!). If your agreements says that you double and jump in NT, you'll be in a really bad situation if the auction is something like:

```
Pass Pass DBL Pass 2♣ Pass ?
```

Your partner could have a very weak hand without the ability to bid 1S. Do you really want to jump to 3NT with 20 point, when your partner has only a queen or a couple of jacks?

The solution is to define an immediate jump to 2NT by balancer as that 19-21 HCP hand. Advancer (balancer's partner) can then use Stayman or a transfer to get you to the best spot.

What do we give up by defining the balancing 2NT bid as strong? You can no longer use the Unusual 2NT jump bid that rarely occurs. However, the payoff for getting to the right spot when you have a big hand is much better than the payoff for throwing in a destructive bid – especially when you can keep the opponents from finding a better spot just by putting the third pass card on the table (and letting declarer struggle in a one-level contract).

The second case is an auction such as:

You opened the bidding, heard two passes and then a balancing double or suit bid, and you as opener now bid NT at the cheapest level.

Many players treat the 1NT rebid as a 12-14 HCP balanced hand, but bridge logic tells you that must be wrong. Why? First, you heard your partner's pass which says that partner has less than 6 HCP – and could be flat broke. If you have 12-14, your side has significantly less than half the high cards in the deck. Why are you trying to compete with a flat hand (1NT rebid, remember?) when the opponents outgun you? You are asking to get doubled and go down a significant amount. The flip side is that your expected gain is at best a part score.

The No Trump rebid after left-hand opponent and partner have passed, should be reserved for a hand that is strong enough to be saying, "Partner, I know that you couldn't muster up a response, but I'm strong enough that this might still be our hand." In other words, you have a hand too big to have opened 1NT; you are showing 18-19 HCP hand.

Other agreements are possible; you as opener might want to use this sequence to show certain distributional two-suiters or some other hand type, but if you and a strong partner have not discussed the auction, expecting it to show 18-19 HCP is the percentage bet.
