





4♠ is a bit aggressive with only 8 HCP, but the club suit is likely to be a good source of tricks opposite the notrump overcall.


West leads the ♥6, to the ♥5, ♥K and ♥A.

South must pull trump before setting up the club suit. Because the spade suit contains the only entries to the club suit (unless the &K is singleton), the high spades must be preserved. South begins the trump suit by leading the &J. East ducks the spade and South continues with a low spade to the king. East wins the second spade trick with the &A and returns a heart. South wins the  $\mathbf{VQ}$ , leaving this position:



Before working on clubs, South draws the last trump. South does not want risk a club ruff. Pulling the last trump leaves only one entry to the clubs, the •9.

South plays a low club to the ♣A and then leads the ♣2. West wins the ♣K, and South can claim. South can win whatever West returns. If West returns a diamond, South will win the ◆A and get to dummy with the carefully-preserved spade to run the clubs.

If South foolishly leads the \$Q\$ from dummy, and lets it run, West should duck. Now the contract cannot be made. The next club from dummy would be won by the \$A. The \$9\$ is still an entry to the long clubs, but the clubs will not run because the \$K\$ is still out.

Timing is everything. South must force the AK while the AY is still in dummy.
