The Lone Star Regional is fast approaching!




The Marriott Westchase is the place, and, hold on to your hats: THERE WILL BE NEW CHAIRS!!!

We encourage advance entry purchase to avoid registration lines. This feature is available through the ACBL's new Entry Express system which can be accessed through acbl.org/entry-express.com. Until further notice, ACBL Covid policies remain in place as per the Centers for Disease Control guidelines. The ACBL still requires all attendees and staff to be vaccinated. Where are we with Face-To-Face?

As you know, ACBL tournament turnout has seen an overall sharp decline in attendance since Covid, as can be seen in the charts below for Houston's Lone Star Regional (LSR) and Sectional table counts. This reduction has posed a tremendous challenge for the Board of Directors whose functions have had to shift to address unprecedented changes both during and post-pandemic.





What is the Board doing to recruit/retain members?

- <u>Future Life Masters (FLM)</u> This program is led by several dedicated volunteers who have been working diligently to promote bridge and assist new and beginner players to master the game. They have been successful with Bridge Base Online (BBO) games and Face-to-Face (F2F) monthly games on Sundays at Shriners with increasing turnout. Visit the <u>FLM website</u> or find the link from the Unit's Homepage (see link above) to learn more about FLM, including a current list of teachers and their classes, and much more.
- <u>Tournaments</u> With five tournaments a year and diminished attendance, we've had to renegotiate hotel contracts and try to

implement other cost-saving measures to preserve the working capital of the unit board. We are dedicated to continuing to provide exciting tournament opportunities for our Unit members as well as ACBL-wide. I am writing this missive from the Kansas City Holiday Regional, a popular and successful tournament in Overland Park, Kansas. I have been traveling to other tournaments to find out how other Units are faring and to get ideas to improve our unit's tournaments. We are also urging everyone we meet to join us in Houston at the LSR.

- Retiree Task force This task force is a recruitment initiative that the Board plans to undertake in between tournament planning. It will target local corporate alumni networks and university alumni organizations. We are looking for volunteers to join the task force and assist the board with this endeavor. Please contact Charles Dalton (dalton@uh.edu) or me if you are interested in helping, or if you have ideas which can help us target other groups who may be interested in our fascinating game.
- <u>Education</u> We had a great opportunity to welcome twenty or more middle-schoolers to play in our LSR tournament as a part of a "minicourse" offered by the school district. Unfortunately, this event had to be cancelled due to ACBL Covid restrictions. We hope to explore these types of opportunities as soon as protocols are lifted. Other ACBL programs underway, including BridgeWhiz and Boost, are very encouraging and we hope that we will gain new players in the near future.
- What you can do Invite your friends and neighbors to learn to play and join our community. If you have friends who are playing online, urge them to come out to the tournaments. Come to the tournaments early and often. Support your local bridge clubs by attending the games—the more tables at the games, the more people will want to come. Give us your ideas, and volunteer to help us implement them.

On behalf of the Unit 174 Board of Directors, I wish everyone a very Happy New Year, filled with health and happiness, as well as lots of successful bridge games.

Lone Star Regional January 23 – 29, 2023



What is a Mini-Soloway KO?

The Mini-Soloway KO is a four-session two-day event with all teams guaranteed two sessions of play on the first day.

- Day 1 is run as a 2-session Swiss/Round Robin depending on the number of teams entered in this event.
- The top 4 teams will advance to the KO phase on Day 2 for the semi-finals and finals.
- The top qualifier will select either the 3rd or 4th place team as their semi-final opponent for the morning session. Play continues in the afternoon to determine 1st and 2nd as well as 3rd and 4th place.

LSR 2023 - Mini-Soloway KO Conditions of Contest

The field will consist of the top bracket equivalent of the regular Bracketed Swiss Events beginning on Tuesday and Thursday. Thus, any team with a masterpoint (MP) average of 12,000 or higher will fall into this bracket and automatically placed into the Mini Soloway.

Teams with a MP average of 12,000 or higher may not play in the Bracketed Swiss on Tuesday or Thursday.

Teams with less than an average of 12,000 may request to participate in the Mini-Soloway KO if they so wish.

The Director-in-Charge may create bracketing for this event if necessary based on MP average. Teams competing understand that this is a 2-day 4-session event.

As only the top 4 teams of a Mini-Soloway bracket will move forward to day 2 of this event, all other teams will be eligible to play in the Swiss Team games the 2nd day.

Mini-Soloway KO Schedule

Tuesday-Wednesday (10am & 2:30pm) and Thursday-Friday (10am & 2:30pm

ACBL COVID Protocols for National, Regional and Sectional Tournaments

EFFECTIVE December 30, 2022

Based upon guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the following will be in effect:

- 1. VACCINATION: All staff, players and volunteers must have been vaccinated no less than 14 days prior to the event in which the player wishes to purchase an entry. (While the ACBL does not require booster shots, the CDC highly recommends the latest booster shots.) Unless prohibited by law, each player must provide proof of vaccination to the Event Safety Coordinator or a member of their staff. In areas or locations where requiring proof of vaccination is prohibited by law, the event sponsor must put in place other precautions, such as mandatory rapid COVID testing and mask requirements. Please check with the Tournament Chair for any changes or updates to this policy.
- 2. MASKING: Masks are optional. Players, staff and volunteers are advised to check the COVID-19 Community Level rate as determined by the CDC or a similar metric from a local health agency in making their decision on masking. Masking is recommended if an attendee is at high risk for severe illness or otherwise is a member of a vulnerable population.

If a masked partnership requests that each of their opponents wear masks, those opponents are expected to comply. This ACBL policy does not countermand any ordinance or law in effect at the site of the tournament.

- **3. HAND SANITIZER**: Hand sanitizer must be readily available inside the playing area.
- **4. EVENT SAFETY COORDINATOR**: Each tournament sponsor must provide a designated Event Safety Coordinator, who will be available to review proof of vaccinations, provide masks, etc.







When it Doesn't Add Up

This hand is from a regional-rated Open Pairs game at the recent ACBL Nationals held in Phoenix. It features thinking that most experts do, and I am learning to do better. My partner was Tom Fogarty from Chicago, and we ended up with two good sessions to win the event.

On board 10, you sit South with both sides vulnerable, East deals. You hold:

♦T5 **♥**AQT852 **♦**J **♣**KQT8

The auction starts out:

East South West North
Pass 1♥ 2♦ Pass
2NT ?

The first thing to discuss is what's going on. West is an experienced tournament player; East is much less experienced in the open pair competition level. Give West an opening hand for the vulnerable 2-level overcall and give East about 10 points.

It seems like it could be dangerous to come in at this point since East may have five hearts with all the missing spots, so South chose to pass. Others might choose to take a different call here, but South is worried about where the spades are located, as well as the chance that partner (North) may be close to broke and then run into a buzz saw.

West thought for longer than usual and was clearly uncomfortable with the choices before making the 3 ◆ call. What is West's hand?

Sitting South, I reasoned that West must not have a very good diamond suit with a good hand, or would have raised 2NT to 3NT – wouldn't you? Therefore, West has either minimum values or bad diamonds. West is also probably very short in hearts, else would have let partner (East) take a shot at taking eight tricks in No Trump.


The auction just doesn't add up as a simple East/West 3♦-making kind of hand, right? Now I think that my partner has some values, and probably some diamond values sitting over West. I am not going to be happy with +100 for 3♦ off one, so I trot out a somewhat risky re-opening double.

If partner (North) has the hand I think he has, he'll convert it to penalties. If he bids 3♥, I will pass and try to make it. If he bids 3♠, I will bid 4♣ and hope to find a fit (but... partner did not originally make a negative double call over the 2♦ bid, so I do not think he has four spades), and if I hear 4♣, I'll pass and I don't think partner will be disappointed in my hand.

The auction concludes:

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East South West NorthPass 1♥ 2♦ Pass2NT Pass 3♦ PassPass Dbl All Pass
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The full board:



With a heart lead (7, 3, Q, J), good defense, and a declarer slip, the contract was set two tricks for +500, which was beaten by only one pair in the field – 37 out of 38 possible matchpoints. +200 would have been almost as good, 35 matchpoints.

The point is to be aware of auctions that "don't quite add up", and to be aware of what the opponents are inadvertently telling you through their mannerisms. You might be able to pick up useful information that leads you to the winning call!

NOTE: The laws of bridge explicitly forbid you to take any inference from your partner's mannerism, tone, tempo, expression, etc. If you do not look at partner, you will be less tempted! You are also not allowed to attempt to deceive the opponents through anything but the bid you make or the card you play – avoid grins, grimaces, frets, and groans. You *are* allowed to take inferences from your opponents' mannerisms, but you do so at your own risk. On this hand, had I misinterpreted West's struggle after his partner's 2NT bid, I would have had no recourse, but I got lucky(?) and guessed right. You, too, can develop this skill the experts call "table feel" and begin to use it to your advantage.

Proper Hand Evaluation and Luck

Proper Hand Evaluation leads to a good contract. With a bit of *Luck,* it even makes.



East is Dealer: Pass

South: 3NT

I normally play this bid as gambling: Showing a running 7+ card minor and no outside Ace or King. However, this partner plays it as a 25-27 HCP hand.

I have all four aces. Even Goren added a point for having all four aces. Marty Bergen suggests adding a point for three aces. An ace is worth about 4.3 points. The 10 with the AK of spades could be useful. That is a plus.

The AQ combination in clubs is worth more than 6 points - unless West is rude enough to have the King of clubs behind me. So, I have 24 HCP + 1 for the aces + extras in clubs and spades - and all prime values - Aces and Kings and a Queen with the Ace. This is an easy 3NT bid.

West: Pass

North: Pass

This Pass is difficult. Normally with a 5-card major North would transfer partner into the 5-card major and then next bid notrump to allow partner to choose between the major and notrump. However, that type of bidding is awkward on this hand, as North would bid $4 \spadesuit$, South would bid $4 \clubsuit$ and North would bid 4 NT. Now South would be choosing between 4 NT and $5 \clubsuit$ - not a good choice. As a practical matter unless you are playing with an established partnership the 4 NT bid could be misinterpreted as some form of Blackwood.

So, North is best either passing like it did, or transferring to hearts and hoping South has 3 of them. Either choice is acceptable, but my choice is to transfer to 4♥ and leave it there. The North hand looks to be of little use in any contract but hearts. And my old partner always told me to be an optimist.

But...I am in 3NT.

West leads the Queen of spades.




I suspect that the lead is from the QJ and seems likely that West has 4 spades for that lead against notrump. I win the ace and give thanks that I didn't get a diamond lead.


Now I pray that the QJ of hearts are doubleton. I play the AK of hearts, They're not. Rats!



I can't score 9 tricks without dummy's hearts so I play my last heart to East's Queen. I hope to reach dummy with the 9 of spades. Maybe North knew the 9 of spades would be an entry to the hearts - probably not.



East wins the Queen of hearts and makes the normal lead of the J \clubsuit , I play the Q \clubsuit which loses to the K \clubsuit . Guess the AQ \clubsuit were only worth 4 points on this deal.



Now it's my lucky day when West returns a club instead of a diamond. Defense is hard.



My 9 of clubs is now good! I play the K♠ and then the 10♠ letting West have its J♠ but that is all for the defense. I win the return and take the remaining tricks. Taking:

- 3 Spades
- 4 Hearts
- 1 Diamond
- 1 Club

Bonus question: West can set the contract by leading the $K \spadesuit$ and then the $Q \spadesuit$. I would duck twice. I would win the third diamond lead. When East gets in with the $Q \spadesuit$, East cashes another diamond. So, the defense scores:

- 3 Diamond
- 1 Heart
- 5 tricks down one.

A second way exists where the defense can set the contract. Check out the screen shots (above) to see the play where the defense made a choice that helped me *before* continuing to read.

Come on now... No Cheating!

When I played a heart to East's Queen, West had to make an uncomfortable discard. West discarded the 2. A better choice would have been a club (not the King).

If West had kept the $2 \spadesuit$, West could let me win the $K \spadesuit$, $10 \spadesuit$. Saved the protected $J \spadesuit$ for my $8 \spadesuit$ (The only entry to dummy).

In conclusion, my partner chose better than I would have. A 4♥ contract is hopeless. It likely loses:

- 1 Spade
- 1 Heart
- 2 Diamonds
- 1 Club

The most common score was 3♥ down 1. I would likely have been in 4♥ down 2.
