President's Message

Unit 174 held its Early Summer Sectional on June 9-11. Although table counts were higher than last year's June Sectional, the turnout was low. Several things need to be considered as we move forward. Our fixed expenses are high although nothing we do is extravagant but; things are expensive. To compensate for the low attendance at our tournaments, we have put some cost-cutting actions in effect. We have eliminated the complimentary Sunday lunch, and the Daughters of the Nile are now making \$10 lunches available for each day of our Sectionals. They are also making the coffee every day as well, which saves us several hundred dollars in additional caddy fees. We eliminated the daily snacks we previously provided. We have a great facility for our Sectionals at the Arabia Shriner Center as well as a symbiotic relationship with their organization, which makes us comfortable.

Our Awesome August Sectional will be from Thursday August 11 through Sunday August 13. It is both an open sectional and an I/N regional. The October Sectional will also be an open sectional and an I/N regional. This means **GOLD** points for all non-life masters!

The one item at the top of the list is: how do we get everyone to attend? We have lowered the price of table fees, and we can offer free plays for those who have not been to one of our tournaments post pandemic. As yet, none of these incentives seem to entice our larger Unit 174 membership to attend. We could change the sectionals to start a day earlier in the week and eliminate the Sunday games. That would mean the April, June and October Sectionals would run from Thursday through Saturday. The August Sectional, which is 4 days, would run from Wednesday through Saturday. The downside of taking this step is that it hurts people who work or attend school during the week. There are only a few weekend club games in Houston, so eliminating Sundays would give this group even less opportunity for a f2f game.

My final thoughts are about the upcoming Fall Sectional, which will be held at Moody Gardens in Galveston from Friday, October 27 through Sunday, October 29. Because the last tournament held there in 2019 was successful, it was rebooked for 2023. Part of the success was due to several large donations that helped considerably. It was also pre-pandemic. Postpandemic tournaments seem to have a whole new set of rules. We are trying to figure them out! The Unit 174 Board of Directors is hard at work to make all these events successful and fun for all. We are not asking for donations - we just want participation! We welcome all suggestions and ideas!

Member Profile



Independence Day

According to the Library of Congress, on **July 4**, 1776, the Second Continental Congress unanimously adopted the Declaration of Independence, announcing the colonies' separation from Great Britain. The Constitution provides the legal and governmental framework for the United States, however, the Declaration, with its eloquent assertion "all Men are created equal," is equally beloved by the American people.

Philadelphians marked the first anniversary of American independence with a spontaneous celebration, which is described in a letter by John Adams to his daughter, Abigail. However, observing Independence Day only became commonplace after the War of 1812. Soon, events such as groundbreaking ceremonies for the Erie Canal and the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad were scheduled to coincide with July 4th festivities. In 1859, the Banneker Institute of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, urged African Americans to celebrate Independence Day while bearing witness to the inconsistencies between the ideals espoused in the Declaration of Independence and the practice of slavery. Chairman of the meeting, Mr. Jacob C. White Jr., also promised his audience a brighter future:

"We have learned by experience and by the comparison of ourselves with people similarly situated, to hope that, at some day not very far in futurity, our grievances will be redressed, that our long lost rights will be restored to us, and that, in the full stature of men, we will stand up, and with our once cruel opponents and oppressors rejoice in the Declaration of our common country, and hail with them the approach of the glorious natal day of the Great Republic."

By the 1870s, the Fourth of July was the most important secular holiday on the calendar. Congress passed a law making Independence Day a federal holiday on June 28, 1870. Even far-flung communities on the western frontier managed to congregate on Independence Day.








Kingwood Duplicate Bridge Club has added a second game on Thursday starting September 8!

Useful Obscure Bids - Part III

This is the third article in a series where I'm taking a brief look at some unusual or rare calls in bridge. While the sequence in today's article doesn't come up often, it's an important one to discuss, because the opportunity for a top score is huge, with low risk. I will be presenting what I believe to be the "standard" meanings, but each partnership should need to discuss the sequences to ensure they are on the same page; other interpretations are possible. Today's topic is one of the more common of our "unusual obscure" bids.

First, the question. (Write down your answer now, and then compare it after reading this article.)

You are playing at a regional tournament in an open pairs event. The opponents are vulnerable and you and your partner are not vulnerable. It is your deal. You hold ♠AQJ74 ♥94 ♠AT93 ♣92. Your style makes this a perfectly normal 1♠ opening, and you make that call. The auction proceeds:

1 • - X - XX - P ?? What's your call?

Their Takeout Double affects our auctions

Partner opens the bidding, and there is a takeout double to your right. What do your calls mean? More than perhaps any other call, that takeout double allows you to make a significant change to your bidding structure to reach the best contract.

Fairly "standard" meanings after the opponent makes a takeout double in front of you are listed below:

- Redouble: Used by almost any 10+ HCP. With use of the Jordan convention, it may imply no fit for partner's suit.
- 2NT: NOT 10-12 HCP balanced; with that we redouble. The Jordan or Truscott convention uses 2NT as the bid to show a limit raise or better for partner. Some require a 4-card fit for the major, others only three. Some use Jordan only over major suit openings. This decision is your and your partner's choice, and the system card lets you show your agreement.
- Pass: Nothing to say.
- 1-level suit bids: much as if there had been no interference; it is forcing one round. It's probably best not to bid bad 4-card suits since RHO has announced length and strength in the unbid suits.
- 1NT: Balanced, something like a good seven to a bad 10 HCP.
- 2/1: NOT a game force! In fact, not even strong! Since we'd redouble with 10+ HCP, a 2/1 is a *non-forcing* change of suit with at least five card length.
- 2 of partner's suit: Standard single raise; strength may be a bit lower than normal.
- 3 of partner's suit: preemptive, four cards if a major, five it partner opened a minor. You have the single raise and 2NT to show a limit raise or better.
- Other jumps in a suit: preemptive, length and strength of suit a function of your vulnerability.

Most of the above options are probably familiar to you. If you don't know Jordan, you can do some research online (and discuss with your partners before playing it!). But a lot fewer know how to use and exploit the redouble, so I'll discuss it here.

The Redouble

(Note: I am only discussing redouble in this article after partner opens one of a suit. When the auction goes 1NT - X - XX, or after 1(suit) - P - P - X, you're in a totally different universe, and other rules and inferences apply!)

We have already mentioned how after an auction like 1-of-a-suit - Double, responder's call of **redouble** shows some 10 or more high card points, and especially if you play Jordan, implies no fit for opener's suit. If your LHO (fourth hand) passes, what is opener supposed to do?

Here are some general considerations:

- 1. We've announced that we have more than half the strength (partner's 12+ and our 10+).
- 2. We've said we don't have a fit for partner's opening suit.
- 3. The opponents may be in trouble, and we are looking for the chance to double them, particularly when the opponents are vulnerable.
- 4. Therefore, we should not
 - a. bid in direct seat unless we are doubling opponents.
 - b. pass in balancing seat, instead double or bid on if we don't have a penalty double.
- 5. 4a and 4b are often summarized as, "Opponents cannot play undoubled below 2NT".
- 6. The one exception is when opener has opened a hand unsuitable for defense: Typically a hand with extra length in the suit and light on HCP. In this case, opener *does not pass at the second bid.*

Example: ♠AQJxxxx ♥x ♦QJx ♣xx 1♠ - X - XX - 2♥

?? With this hand opener should rebid spades rather than pass the 2♥ bid. With all normal opening bids, the opener passes unless holding a penalty double of 4th hand's bid.
 7. An important inference: Opener can show hands with extra strength

by

passing at the second turn, and then bidding strongly later. Responder must be alert for this. If opener has a weak hand for defense opener bids at the second turn to show it. If opener passes at the second turn and bids something unexpected later, opener's hand is strong and thinks your side will score better playing the hand rather than defending.

Let's look at some example auctions:

1♦ - X - XX - 2♣ P	Opener has a normal hand. Strength could be 12 - 20 HCP. Opener does not have a hand to double (penalty) 2.
1♥ - X - XX - P P	Opener has a normal hand and is waiting to see where the opponents scramble.
1 ♠ - X - XX - 2 ♣ 2 ♦	Opener has a distributional hand with less defense than partner expects, say, ♠AQJxxx ♥x ♦QJxxx ♣x, and doesn't want to sit for a double of 2♣.
1 ♠ - X - XX - 2 ♣ X 1♥ - X - XX - P	Opener has a hand with defense against their club suit contract such as ♠KQTxxx ♥Ax ♦xx ♣KJxx, and doubles to confirm that opponents are in trouble.
P - 2 - P - P	
??	Responder can't double 2 [,] ; but opener in pass out seat <i>cannot pass</i> 2 [,] . Rather, opener must double 2 [,] with a suitable hand (3+ decent clubs), or make whatever call the hand suggests if unable to double.The pass by responder <i>does</i>

There are other auctions possible, but the main points to remember are that the redouble sets up an auction where we look for the chance to double the opponents for penalty. Be careful to weigh your offensive vs. defensive prospects especially when your side likely has a game and you are vulnerable, but in my experience (especially as people are making many more off-shape takeout doubles now, and may not have 4-4 or 5-3 fits), there are opportunities for big penalties if you work with your partner on auctions with redoubles of a takeout double.

Here's a hand that came up in a Flight A open pairs event recently where the doubler was a top-rated pro:

The Answer

You are playing at a regional tournament in an open pairs event. The opponents are vulnerable and you and your partner are not vulnerable. It is your deal. You hold ♠AQJ74 ♥94 ♦AT93 ♣92. Your style makes this a perfectly normal 1♠ opening, and you make that call. The auction proceeds:

What would you have done before this article?

What's your call now?

This is a normal opening bid with 2.5 quick tricks, and lots of tens and nines, which help whichever side holds them. I see no reason *not to pass* and let the opponents try to scramble for whatever they can. If we can double for penalties at this vulnerability, even down two beats any game we can make.

1 ♠ - X - XX - P 2 ♦ - P - ??

When opener rebid $2 \blacklozenge$, our top was defenestrated. North is never going to bid again! I had to content myself with a bid of 3NT, and make ten tricks for only 42%.

As you can see, N/S cannot make anything (and it's even worse for them than normal since E/W have almost *all* the tens and nines!). Their "best" contract after the redouble is 2♥, where they can take four tricks – that's 1100 for East/West and a tie for top (one other N/S was in 1NT doubled, also off four tricks). That translates to increasing our score by 6.4 gold points as we would have moved into second place overall in this tough event.

The moral of the story: Learn how to use a redouble after a takeout double. Arm your partnerships with the ability to extract large penalties from the opponents when they step into your auctions.
