### **Introducing: Paddy Fiorino**

Paddy Fiorino was born in northeastern Iowa. Her family moved to Marshalltown when she was five and she grew up there, graduating from Marshalltown High School. She went to college at the University of Iowa where she got a Bachelor's degree majoring in General Science. After graduation, Paddy got her certificate in Physical Therapy in 1979.

Her husband was transferred to Stafford Texas a few months after graduation, and she has remained in the Houston area ever since. She worked as a Physical Therapist from 1979 – 2019.

With work and family Paddy had little time for herself, but in 2019 she began working part time and visited her sister in California.

Paddy had only, on rare occasions, filled in for her parent's bridge foursome. Her sister played bridge her

entire adult life and was an avid duplicate player.

Her sister insisted that she continue with duplicate and found Eric Watson's (Fort Bend Duplicate Bridge Club owner) phone number on the internet. She called Eric and told him that Paddy would be calling him. Eric found Paddy a partner and she started playing at Eric's club on a regular basis. Later, Paddy found and started playing at Westside Bridge Academy.

She and her sister played in a Regional in Reno. Her sister had 4800 points and Paddy had one. They played side games and Paddy won 17 points at her first tournament.

Paddy won the Unit 174's 2020 Ace of Clubs and was 6th in the nation. She had only been playing duplicate a year and a half when COVID struck. She played regularly online during the COVID shutdown and became Life Master in March of 2021.

Paddy said that she appreciates her many mentors. She is especially grateful to Jay Evert who taught her the basics and introduced her to several books which she has read.

She is now a Ruby Life Master and lacks only 400 black points to make Gold Life Master.

Retirement has given Paddy little rest. She was asked and accepted the position of Unit 174 Secretary where she is still learning what reports go to whom.

She loves playing bridge and has played soccer for 20+ years. In the past year, she resumed crafting (making decorations, wreaths, tole painting), sewing, reading, playing golf, and playing the piano after a 20+ year hiatus

Look for this very busy lady at the bridge table where you will find a friendly but competitive opponent.





In an earlier article we looked at an advanced play (*the crossruff*) where rather than drawing trumps, declarer scored the trumps individually.

In this article we will look at another advanced play involving the trump suit. The trump coup occurs when declarer discovers a key card is onside but lacks the trumps in dummy to take advantage of it. Declarer must attempt to reduce the number of trumps held to the same number as held by the right-hand opponent. Declarer arranges the entries so that the lead will be from dummy at the end of the hand.


Example:

Assume spades are trump and North is declarer.



With the lead from dummy declarer calls for the  $\clubsuit6$ . East is helpless. If the  $\blacklozenge9$  is played, North plays the  $\blacklozenge0$ . If the  $\bigstarK$  is played, North plays the  $\bigstarA$ .

Let's look at the complete hand:



The bidding should best be forgotten. North opened  $1 \bigstar$  and East made a takeout double. After that North-South reached an ambitious contract of  $6 \bigstar$ .

The opening lead was the  $\mathbf{V}Q$ . Dummy wins the  $\mathbf{V}A$ . With the  $\mathbf{A}A$  to lose declarer sees that the trump finesses must be on. Declarer could play to drop the stiff  $\mathbf{A}K$  offside but this doesn't seem very likely.

Declarer calls for a spade from dummy and hooks the 10 which wins.

Things are looking up.

Declarer returns to dummy with the ♥K and finesses the ♠J which also wins but East shows out. Things have gotten darker.


Declarer pauses to consider whether there is any hope of making the contract. The dummy holds no more trumps so the only way the **A**K can be captured is through a coup. Declarer must try to reduce the number of trumps held to two (the same number as West) and wind up at the twelfth trick with the lead from dummy.

Without planning it out to the end, the first step must be to lead a club. East takes the A and returns the 2, Declarer wins the Q in dummy. Next, declarer ruffs a heart.

At this point a new danger has arisen. Based upon the takeout double and the lead of the  $\blacklozenge$ 2, declarer visualizes West's distribution to be 4333. If declarer goes to dummy and trumps a heart, West will pitch a diamond and declarer will be unable to cash the remaining two.

Declarer leads A and another diamond to dummy's Q, all following suit.

Now things look better. Declarer ruffs a heart and West pitches a club. Finally, declarer leads a club to dummy's &K and ends up in the position shown at the beginning of the article:



Six spades bid and made.

North can count lucky stars to have made this slam. It required both the A and K to be onside. Once this happened and spades did not break 3-2, North also needed to find West with 4333 distribution. After all this good luck the opponents were rolling their eyes wondering what they had done to deserve this disastrous result.

#### Summary

In a trump coup declarer attempts to finesse through the right-hand opponent with no trumps left in the dummy. To accomplish this feat, declarer must reduce the number of trumps held to the same number as the right-hand opponent and maneuver to have the lead in dummy at the end of the hand.
