

President's Message

Spring is in the air. March brings the vernal equinox, the full worm moon, March Madness and St. Patrick's Day. It's also the month our clock's jump forward for daylight savings time and we lose an hour of sleep. That's okay since everyone at the bridge table will be tired with us. More importantly, the April Election Sectional is quickly approaching. Before I touch on this I'd like to acknowledge a few noteworthy items from our recent Lone Star Regional (LSR) and touch upon our current state of affairs.

Congratulations to Jack LaVigne who is this year's district 16 Star award recipient. Many thanks to Jack for his hard work and outstanding contributions to the District as well as the Unit. This year's Goodwill award recipients are Linda Drake and Mary Ellen Vail. Congratulations and many thanks to these ladies for their continuous hard work and dedication!

Many thanks to this year's LSR Tournament Chair Karen Nussbaum for her hard work, and thanks to all the volunteers who helped make this event a success. Thank you, Ken Hudson (Partnership), Marty Hrachovy (I/N), Jane Armstrong (Hospitality), John Herzer (Event Naming), and the entire FLM team! An additional thanks goes out to all the volunteers who continuously commit their time to help make our tournaments a success. **Attendance is improving;** however, the unit continues to suffer a financial loss since tournaments have resumed postpandemic. Measures are being explored to reduce costs as well as boost tournament attendance. The chart below shows the attendance trend for the Lone Star Regional tournaments over the past several years, with 2020 and 2021 omitted due to the pandemic.



Although we are nowhere near pre-Covid attendance, we did see a 47% increase this year over last year. Even with the most optimistic speculation however, attendance is unlikely to meet the levels prior to the pandemic. This issue presents a significant challenge for the Unit Board whose primary focus, as stated in the by-laws, is to plan and run tournaments.

This focus worked well before the pandemic, but things have since changed considerably. Not only has membership dropped off and face-to-face play declined, but inflation has had a significant effect on running tournaments, with increased hotel rates/fees, food prices, printing costs, etc. Our annual regional tournament typically brings in enough profit to fund the four sectional tournaments held throughout the year. It will be difficult to sustain this model unless we get more people to the tournaments and costs are reduced. To effectively attract more tournament attendance, the Board must shift its focus and allocate significant effort to attract new and potentially returning-players. We need the resources and time to plan and organize good tournaments. We need volunteers. We need your help. We need a continuous committed Board of Directors. Future Life Masters (FLM), one of our board-supported programs, is having great success with new players. The program is focused on 0-99 MPs players and has contributed to tournament attendance by increasing table counts at LSR by three-fold over the prior year. This team of volunteers continues to develop more initiatives to support our local 'Beginner' bridge community; slow down the attrition of new players by engaging them, provide resources via a dedicated <u>FLM website</u> and assist in the development of entry-level games. The April Election Sectional will be held at the Arabia Shrine Center April 14 - 16. The GNT finals will be held on Saturday and Sunday. The Unit will host its 175th Annual Membership Meeting on Saturday, April 15. This meeting was moved from Sunday to encourage greater attendance and ensure a quorum is achieved. The annual award presentation will occur and the election results will also be presented on Saturday, with candidates

selected to fill three board positions. Voting will take place one hour before each session of the tournament on Friday and on Saturday morning. Early online voting will be available from March 6 to April 11 at 3 pm. Information about the candidates and further voting information can be found on the <u>Unit webpage</u>. We hope there will be a good turnout and look forward to seeing ya'll there!

As manager of the Lake Conroe Duplicate Bridge Club, I have the honor of sitting at the bridge table every Friday with some amazing bridge players and wonderful people. In selecting our first highlighted member profile, I had so many choices from which to select, I really didn't know where to begin! Everyone has a story and I am proud to have Norm and Joyce Gautier as our first club story.





Joyce and Norm Gautier played their first duplicate bridge over six decades ago in the days before zero tolerance, frequently in smoke-filled rooms. Joyce started playing in college and "taught" Norm shortly after their marriage in 1961.





Card Reading

Double dummy means that the hand is declared and defended perfectly *and* that all cards are known by both the declaring and defending side.

Card reading is an attempt to play double dummy as though you can see the whole hand, either as declarer or defender.

It happens as you learn the distribution and high card location of cards from the bidding, leads and signals, and then inferring the location and distribution of the unseen cards.

Example: DIr: E

♠♥♦	orth Qx Kx Axx Kxxxx		
South	West	North	East
Pass 2NT	Pass Pass	1NT 3NT	1 ♦ Pass All Pass

You have completed your Bracketed Swiss team match early and decide to kibitiz a hand from the top bracket. The bidding is as shown above. North's 1NT is a balancing action showing approximately 11-14 HCPs. South invites with the 2NT bid and North with 12 HCPs points and a five-card suit with lots of 10's and 9's, accepts the invitation.

The opening lead is the ♥2 and dummy comes down with

West wins with the $\forall A$ and returns the $\forall 3$.

A count of the tricks shows one heart, one diamond and two spades. If declarer assumes that the club suit comes in for five tricks, that is nine tricks.

From the opening lead and return, it looks like hearts are breaking 4-4 so declarer can afford to knock out the A after winning the next five clubs and will only lose four tricks. The play goes &K from North, all following suit and a low club is led toward dummy's AJx.




You mentally say, "*Eight ever. Nine never,*" so you expect declarer to play the &A. You are surprised the &J is played and wins the trick when West shows out!

Why did declarer make this play?

The actual hand was:





Declarer did some card reading. From the opening lead and return, declarer places ♥Axxx in the West hand. If West held the ♣Qx, the hand's HCP would have been six and would have warranted 1♥ or possibly 1♠ response to partner's opening 1♦ bid.

Since West passed, declarer *sees* the §Q in the East hand and West with a stiff club.

If declarer had played the A the contract would end up down two: the opponents would get one club, three hearts and then drive out the A before declarer established spades.

Declarer makes three notrump by hooking the **\\$J**.

Summary

Card reading is an attempt to play double dummy as though you can see the whole hand. It takes experience, practice and the ability to fully concentrate on the hand before you. The benefits are well worth the effort. You will take more tricks and score better as you master this skill.

Useful Obscure Bids

Over the next months, we'll look at some rare auctions that are worth discussing in regular partnerships. While I present what I believe to be "standard" meanings, each partnership will need to discuss the sequences to ensure they are on the same page; other interpretations are possible. In all honesty, most of these auctions come up very rarely, but when the opportunity presents itself, you have an easy path to the right contract that might be difficult for others to find.

Part 1: Opponents open 1 of a suit, we bid 3 of that suit.

The two relevant cases of this sequence are:

- Opponents open in a minor, and we bid three of the minor: (1♣) 3♣ or (1♠) - 3♠, and,
- Opponents open in a major, and we bid three of the major: (1♥) 3♥, or (1♠) 3♠

Case 1 is a more common of the unusual sequences we'll cover. We know that people often open 1* on a three-card suit (and some open with a "short club" that could be a doubleton, or even sometimes a singleton). Even 1* is often only four cards can be as short as three. In these cases, it's not unusual that overcaller could have length in the minor, and might even been planning to open with a three-level preempt in opener's suit. What to do?

The "standard" meaning of overcaller's jump to 3 of opener's minor suit is: "I was going to open 3 (or 3) but was beaten to it; I see no reason not to make that call anyway." Your hand might be something like A K7 P 863 4 9 ♣AJT8652. Obviously, we need to be aware of the vulnerability. We don't expect partner to do anything other than pass or raise, and with the right hand, we'd welcome a continuation of the preempt by raising us to the four-or even 5-level – suppose partner has as little as ♠A764 ♥3 ♠AT965 ♣943; 5♣ looks like a really good bet!

In any case, this bid has great preemptive value, and may take the opponents into uncharted territory – is a double by responder takeout or penalty? Discuss with your partner; if you agree about the natural meaning of a jump to three of opener's minor, I hope you'll get good use out of the bid!

Case 2 is much different – when your right hand opponent opens in one of a major, the bid almost always shows at least five cards. It's much less likely that we have seven cards in openers suit, and even if we do, the odds that it is right to play in 3. When RHO has opened 1. are slim! So, how should we define these sequences:

(1♥) - 3♥? (1♠) - 3♠?

Fortunately, those who have gone before us have found a useful (if rare!) meaning for these sequences. They are defined to show a hand with a long solid minor (AKQxxxx) and 8+ total tricks, but no stopper in the opener's major. The bid is saying, "Partner, I have the tricks for you if you have a stopper in opener's suit. If you do have a stopper, please bid 3NT."

Your hand might be AX = AJx AKQTxxx for a call of 3 = 0 over opener's 1 = 0 bid. Partner having as little as AJxxx = QJT + xxxx + xx has an excellent chance of making 3NT.

What if advancer (your partner) doesn't have a stopper in opener's major? Simplest is he should relay to clubs at whatever level as "pass or correct" – if overcaller's solid suit is diamonds, overcaller corrects to diamonds at the same level. With no stopper, advancer's actions are like what they would be after a gambling 3NT opening.

Note that when the opponents end up in 3NT after one of these 1Major -3Major auctions, from the defense's perspective leading dummy's solid suit might be the most effective defense, with the goal of not giving up the 9th trick!
