



Not So Fast!

This is a hand from the Summer 2023 Nationals in Chicago.

No one is vulnerable. Your RHO deals and passes, and you hold ♠Q9873, ♥T8753, ◆ -, ♣Q84.

I didn't have any trouble passing, and I don't think you would, either!

LHO opens 2♦, partner doubles, and RHO bids 3♦.

At this point, you have some choices. An experienced partnership might let you bid $4 \blacklozenge$ to show both majors but not necessarily a lot of strength. I was not playing with a regular partner, so I contented myself with a $3 \blacklozenge$ call, showing some values, and expecting that wouldn't be the end of the auction.

P P 2 ◆ X 3 ◆ 3 ◆ P 3NT P ?

And it wasn't. What to do over 3NT? Partner has a big hand with 18 and would overcall 2NT directly, so I expect a good 19+. I don't know what the top range would be! In any case, a $4 \checkmark$ call seems right. I can't see leaving partner in 3NT when I have two five-card majors and a void in diamonds.

The 4 call ends the auction. LHO leads the \Rightarrow 10, and dummy is tabled:



Decide what to play on trick one before continuing.

Partner has a *very* nice hand for you. You are likely to take at least ten tricks. Your obvious losers are one spade, likely one heart (as long as hearts aren't split 3-0 with RHO holding 3 over dummy), no diamonds, and a club (one club can be pitched on the \blacklozenge A). The contract is not iron-clad; things can go wrong.

What do you do on trick 1 – from dummy's AJ4, which card do you play? Over 80% of the intermediate players I've given this hand to, play the A at trick 1 and pitch a club. I say, "Not so fast!" I don't think we know what we want to do with that A yet. There is no rush. Diamonds are most likely 6430, but even if they are 7330, the A isn't getting ruffed by RHO.

There are two more considerations to think about. If we *need* to pitch a club, we'll always have a chance later. We have the A in the same hand as the A, so we can always get to the A for a club pitch if needed. Also, we need to get to our hand to lead a trump toward dummy. Why not ruff a diamond on the first round so we are where we need to be, and save the A as a stopper should we need it later?

Think about this: when we play low on that $\blacklozenge 10$, RHO plays the King! Now we have a tenace position over LHO's very likely $\blacklozenge Q$. If either opponent leads diamonds, they give us *two* diamond tricks, and that might come in handy later.

Therefore, we ruff the diamond low, and lead the $\mathbf{10}$ toward dummy. LHO is such a cooperative sort, and plays the \mathbf{V} K(!) as his partner follows with the \mathbf{V} 6, so we know hearts are split 2-1, and we don't have a heart loser.

We draw the last trump, RHO follows, and now we must decide how to tackle spades and clubs, and which to go after first? It seems clear that, with three trumps left in dummy, we could play A and a spade, giving the opponents their deserved spade trick, and then ruff three spades in dummy, pitching a club from hand on the (preserved) A, so we would end up losing a spade and a club. Can we do better?

Let's play a low spade to the A and see what happens. LHO plays the A and RHO follows with the A2. Hmmm.... Now when we lead the A6 from dummy, RHO plays low (A5). What's going on? Here are some possibilities:

- LHO could have had the singleton ◆J, and RHO ◆KT542. In this case, going up with the ◆Q on the second round means we don't lose a spade trick – tempting, but is it likely? Spades would be 5521 around the table.
- 2. LHO could have the AJ10 doubleton and be false-carding. In this case, going up with the AQ also avoids a spade loser. How likely is this? Spades would be 5422.
- 3. LHO could have the ♠KJ doubleton. Now, playing one of the ♠987 loses to his ♠K, but it also means that spades are 5422, and some magic can happen!

I took a long time to think, and decided that RHO was unlikely to have ducked the AKing, and thus LHO with AKJ doubleton was likely. I put in the A8 (never give an opponent an honest card if you can avoid it) and was gratified to see the AK win the trick on my left.

Do you see what happens now, and why I was excited?

LHO now can't lead a diamond (remember, that gives me two club pitches if, as is likely, he started with the \blacklozenge QT9), so the \clubsuit 10 is lead. Should I let it run around to my \clubsuit Q?

No!

I won the A and called for the Jack which I ruffed. I played the good Q and pitched a club from dummy (LHO showed out by pitching a diamond while RHO followed with the A). I now led one of my two last spades and ruffed it as RHO played the 10 - his last spade.

At trick 10 I could lead the Ace and *trump it in hand* as an entry to my last good spade. I played that last spade, pitching the last club from dummy, and claimed, since in the two-card ending, dummy had two trump and no one else had any (or, the two clubs in my hand could now be ruffed in dummy).

In the end, I lost just one spade trick. Four Hearts making six for +680 was an 83% board, and a gratifying use of the maxim, "**Not so fast!**"

(Note: Yes, on this hand with careful play, Declarer has enough entries to set up spades even if the ♦A at trick1 but it wasn't necessary. Leaving the ♦A in dummy allowed declarer to be where needed for trick 2's lead of a heart, and provided the flexibility later in the hand (for instance, had hearts been split 3-0).
