

Did You Know about Slam Invite?

This hand is from the recent Atlanta Fall Nationals of the ACBL. It's interesting on a couple levels – auction and play. It came up in the 0-10,000 Fast Pairs, second session of the first day.

Dealer is East and passes. As south, you hold:

♠A Q 10 4 ♥Q 4 ♦A Q 10 ♣K 9 8 2

You are playing 14+ to 17 NT.

Nice hand! If the ♥Q weren't doubleton, you might consider it too strong to open 1NT because of the strong intermediate cards and the nice honor combinations – but you choose to take the conservative course and open 1NT. The auction proceeds:

West North East South Pass 1NT

Pass	2 🔶 *	Pass	2♥**
Pass	4♥	Pass	?

* Hearts

** You only have two hearts, so despite the maximum-strength hand, you must bid 2.

What does partner's sequence mean? If you and your partner haven't discussed this sequence, it's an important auction to define in your bidding structure.

First, North must have a six-card (or longer) heart suit. With just five hearts and game values, North would transfer, and then rebid 3NT (which you would pass with a doubleton heart, or pull to 4♥ with three or four). But North set hearts as trump, and since you could have only two, North must have at least six hearts to know that there is an eight-card fit.

Second, had North merely wanted to play in four hearts a *Texas Transfer* (a jump to 4 ◆ to transfer to hearts, or a jump to 4 ♥ to transfer to spades) would be used. These bids show at least six cards in responder's suit and game values, and opener *must* complete the transfer. Since opener has no choice but to complete the transfer, and responder can then choose to pass or bid on, responder is the absolute captain, while opener is but a puppet.

Contrast this with the auction at our table: North bids $2 \diamond$ as a transfer to hearts, then rebids $4 \clubsuit$. This allows South the option to bid again. One basic principle of bidding is that you shouldn't have two sequences that mean the same thing (there aren't nearly enough bids to describe all possible hands, and giving up even one to a duplicate meaning is terribly wasteful), so experts define the Jacoby Transfer-then-jump-to-four sequence as a "mild" slam invitation – not forcing, but asking partner to bid to slam if their hand is near perfect. With that in mind, let's evaluate opener's (South) hand (repeated here):

♠A Q 10 4 ♥Q 4 ♦A Q 10 ♣K 9 8 2

First, it's 17 HCP, top of our range. It's got great intermediates, and honors in combination (this hand would be significantly weaker without the two tens, or even without the \$9 8). The only possible flaw is that it only has two hearts; but it has a key honor (\P Q), and responder must have at least six hearts on this auction (else North would have rebid 3NT, not 4 \P).

Looking at your hand, you expect partner to have something like ♥AKxxxx and either the pointed kings (spades and diamonds), or the ♣A with either the ♣Q or a pointed King because North is mildly inviting slam. Those hands are about 13 HCP and have the trick-taking potential opposite a hand like your hand to consider slam (but no interest opposite a "bad" 17 HCP). Given that, you take the invitation and bid 6♥.

The opening lead was the **&J** and this somewhat disappointing dummy is tabled:

Dlr: East Vul: None North ♠6 5 3 ♥A K J 9 7 6 ♦9 8 ♣A 6

♣J



South ♦A Q 10 4

So, I was declarer (South) and I sure wish partner had a bit more. My thought at the table was, "Oh, geez, I've got so many holes here!" Regardless, I'm in the contract I'm in, how am I going to come to 12 tricks?

I've got six hearts, two clubs, and the two pointed aces (A, A) for 10 top tricks. I can hope that both kings are onside (spades and diamonds) to get me to 12; that is a 25% chance (the K is onside half the time, and of that 50%, the K is also onside half the time, so *both* finesses 'work' half of half the time, or one in four times, 25%).

I can improve these odds by finessing against the AK and AJ and the AK - taking three finesses and making the contract if two of the finesses work - that's a 50% shot, so twice as good as finessing against the kings alone.

Can I do better than 50%? Yes! I have a total of seven spades between the two hands, thus the defenders have six. If I finesse in spades first and only one of the A or A is onside, there's a chance that the outstanding spades

are split 3-3, in which case I can use my 4th spade to pitch one of dummy's two diamonds and not care about the \blacklozenge K. This idea seems to be about a 52% chance (I make the hand if both spades are onside (25%) plus if (either the \blacklozenge K or \blacklozenge J is onside) AND (the suit splits 3-3), which I compute as 75% for one or both spade honors onside, times 36% that the suit is 3-3, or 27%. 25% plus 27% is 52%). *Phew!*

The point is to always think about setting up your long suit when it's five cards or more, and sometimes you can even do that when you have four cards opposite three!

There are some minor additional chances in the club suit if you note that you have the &A K 9 8 in your possession, and the &J was led. Maybe the &Q or &J T are doubleton and you can establish your &9 or &8 for a diamond pitch?

Are there any other chances? Why, I'm glad you asked because there's one very important chance. Look – I'm lazy at the table. I'd much rather my opponents do my work for me if I can get them to – particularly when it increases my chances of success... and this hand is a perfect example of doing that through an endplay. It's a bit complicated but follow along to see how you can work to really maximize your chances by taking advantage of all your opportunities!

Look at the spots – the perfect tenaces (*at least two high honor cards of the same suit but missing the one in between*) in spades and diamonds! If I can eliminate clubs and draw trump (in three rounds, I hope) and then take a finesse in either diamonds or spades, *even if the finesse loses, LHO will be forced to give up a trick when then on lead*!

Here's the position I want to get to, with the lead in dummy (North):



If I lead a spade from dummy and play the \$10 if RHO plays low, what can LHO do if the \$J wins? A diamond return eliminates my diamond loser directly (and means I'm on the 75% chance of needing just one of two spade honors to be onside), and a spade both eliminates my spade loser and may help set up my fourth spade for a diamond pitch. It's even better if LHO wins the \$K; the return of either pointed suit gives me my 12th trick.

Conclusion

Did you know about the slam invite that North's 2♦-then-4♥ showed? Did you think about eliminating clubs so that you could try to endplay LHO, or did your thinking stop at "I can draw trump and hope some of the finesses work"?

You might wonder how things worked out at the table. Better than I had any right to expect, as it turns out. I won the &A in dummy and then led to my &K, noticing that LHO played the &10! Now I strongly suspect that the initial club holding was &J T opposite &Q7xxx, and I was ecstatic! If LHO started with a doubleton club, that suit was already eliminated from West's hand; I could draw trump and lead a spade to the &10 for a delicious endplay.

On top of that good fortune, when I led a spade toward my hand, the AK popped up – it turned out that RHO (East) had been dealt AK J doubleton of spades:

♦KJ ♥1082 ♦432 **♣**Q7543

As a bonus, since I'd counted out LHO's hand as starting with four spades, two hearts, five diamonds, and two clubs, I knew it was safe at trick 12 to lead a diamond to my \blacklozenge Q. If LHO (West) had the \blacklozenge K, it had only it and another diamond left, so I would score my \blacklozenge A no matter what.

Being in 6♥ making was worth 96%. You can play through this hand yourself if you load it into a teaching table on BBO – the link is <u>http://tinyurl.com/yksbckac</u>
