(A teams need not qualify at the club/unit level and will compete at the district level during the Election Sectional in the spring.) To qualify for the Grand National Team sin B, you must have no A players on your team; to qualify in C, you must have no A or B players on your team. We hope to see Unit 174 well represented again!

Do you wonder what these big Masterpoint Milestone Rank Awards signify?

First, there are colors requirements, and here are the ACBL's color designations: **NET POINTS** are awarded for online play and are colorless. **BLACK POINTS** are for club games and some Unit games. **SILVER POINTS** are awarded for events at sectional tournaments and at club StaC games. **RED POINTS** are for Regional tournaments and regional events at NABCs, except for overall and section tops, which are Gold. Grand National Teams events and North American Pairs events afford players the opportunity to earn red points at their local clubs. **GOLD POINTS** are awarded for overall placings and section tops in regional and NABC events where the top masterpoint limit is at least 750, and may may be given for special games, such as the Instant Matchpoint Game, Grand National Team and North American Pair events.

PLATINUM POINTS are awarded for NABC+ events and include the national-rated senior and women's events with no upper masterpoint limit but not the junior, flight B, or other restricted events.

Second, there are total MP levels. Generally, **Bronze** Life Master is a Life Master ("LM") with 750; **Silver** Life Master is LM with 1000 (at least 200 silver, red, gold or platinum); **Ruby** Life Master is LM with 1500 (at least 300 silver, red, gold or platinum); **Gold** Life Master is LM with 2500 (at least 500 silver, red, gold or platinum); **Sapphire** Life Master is LM with 3500 (at least 700 silver, red, gold or platinum, of which at least 350 must be gold or platinum); **Diamond** Life Master is LM with 5000 (at least 1000 silver, red, gold or platinum, of which at least 500 must be gold or platinum); **Emerald** Life Master is LM with 7500 (at least 1500 silver, red, gold or platinum, of which at least 750 must be gold or platinum); **Platinum** Life Master is LM with 10,000 (at least 2000 silver, red, gold or platinum, of which at least 1000 must be gold or platinum, with a minimum of 100 platinum); and **Grand Life Master**, the highest rank in the **ACBL**, is LM with 10,000 (at least 2000 silver, red, gold or platinum, of which at least 1000 must be gold or platinum, with a minimum of 100 platinum), and a whole bunch of other requirements!

News from Clubs

Bridge Club of Houston will hold a New Year's Day Party on Monday, **January 1**, with a pot luck meal at 11 a.m. and game at 11:55. On Sunday, January 7, they will host **MiniBridge**, so if you know someone who wants to become a bridge player, this is a good place to start! On January 20, at 11:45 a.m. they will hold their Membership Meeting and Election of Board Members, followed by a Pairs Game and the new Board will meet at 4 p.m. Saturday, Jan. 27, is **GNT Qualifying** for B and C.

Westside Bridge Academy surveyed its patrons in October for insights into why certain games experienced lower than historical table counts, and asking what they could do to improve participation. They had 224 responses, and two things came up often (and they are probably universal): (1) Lack of partners, particularly by the I/N players; and (2) Rude behavior by players, in particular the open players. Here is how they will address those issues. They will hire a partnership

chairperson, with initial focus will be on the I/N games. They will continue their Ambassador program. They will renew their emphasis on Zero Tolerance and implement a way of keeping track of Zero Tolerance violations. For example, currently if a player does something on Monday that violates ZT, the director gives that person a warning. A second violation is penalized by a ¼ board or 4-IMP penalty. But if the second violation comes during a later *session*, that session's director likely has no knowledge of what happened on Monday. So they will implement a process where the directors will enter the dates, times, and descriptions of ZT violations in a spreadsheet (as done for free plays). When an entry is made, the director will also send an email to the Yahoo group so all are informed. Further details may be found at the club's Website: **www.westsidebridgeacademy.com**. It is a good thing that helps the game for all of us when a club gets information from its players and then acts on it. These problems exist at all clubs. *Good job*, *Westside*!

Clear Lake Bridge Club recently replaced all of its cards. Nancy Guthrie made sure that instead of discarding the decks, they were donated to HOME (Help Our Military Endure). The club she received this nice note from Trudy Duhon, President of HOME: "Thank you and all of your volunteers who help make the boards at our Clear Lake Bridge Club.
