#### **INTERESTING BRIDGE HANDS**

#### **ASK JEFF** by Jeff Kroll

Part I - Lesson on Matchpoints vs IMPs: Bridge lesson 1-3 2022 (rev 1).mp4 on Vimeo

QUESTION 1. Using Position, Quality, and a Void in Hand Evaluation to give you and your partner the option to explore for a slam.

You hold this hand in the first seat but, it should be made in any seat.

- ♣ void
- **♥** AK97643
- ♦ A92
- ♣ KQ2

What would you open and why?

#### JEFF KROLLS ANSWER:

If I was the first bidder, I would open it 2C, and these are the reasons:

- 1. It's a 4-loser hand: 1 heart, 2 diamonds, and 1 club.
- 2. I promise at least 2 aces and 2 kings for a 2C bid. I have them. If

the opponents go to 4S and partner doubles, I'll sit for it.

- 3. If they go to 4S and my partner doesn't double, then it's up to me whether I want to double or go on to 5H. With this hand, I'd bid 5H.
- 4. Usually, I would have 19 hcp for a 2C bid. But this hand has all prime values and is odds on to make 4H opposite very little from my partner.

My second choice would be to open it 1H, planning on jump shifting into one of the minors on my second bid. That would be forcing to game. I prefer the 2C opening bid as I think we would have a better chance of finding a possible slam.

Opening 1H and bidding any number of hearts on my second bid would grossly underbid this hand.

Of course, opening 4H is preemptive and makes a good slam impossible to find.

If there is an interfering bid over the strong 2C, partner should double with a bust - no ace or king, Passing shows an ace or king.

If there was a bid before I got a chance to bid 2C, I would make a take-out double. Partner will assume I have at least 3 card support for the 3 unbid suits (which is not true). However, when I bid my hearts on my second bid, partner should realize I have a big hand (17+ points) and a rebiddable heart suit and not necessarily support for the other suits. So my hand will be clarified.

#### **Expected bidding from partner:**

I am a strong supporter of Larry Cohen's bidding. For several years now, he has written what the standard bids mean in the ACBL Bulletin.

So, this is how I like to respond to a 2C bid:

- If I have a 5 card major and 8+ points, I will bid it
- Otherwise, I'll bid 2D.

If I have a bust hand (no ace or king), after partner (the 2C opener) shows her suit, I will bid the cheaper minor. So, if the 2C bidder now bids 2H, or 2S, I will bid 3C. If the 2C bidder now bids 3C, I will bid 3D. If the 2C bidder now bids 3D, so as not to bid past 3NT, by convention, I will bid 3NT as the cheaper minor bid.

One more thought. Voids are great when you have trump support for partner. They can be worth as much as 5 points. Marty Bergen wrote that voids are magical. Sometimes they are. I'd view the void in

spades as a plus when first evaluating this hand, but would not add points for it unless the bidding gave me a clue that it would be useful. If the opponents bid spades, then my void is useful when we declare. If my partner bids a suit other than spades then my void in spades can be a valuable control and would be useful.

#### **QUESTION 2. Borrowing a King**

This situation happened at the tournament, so I cannot put a picture of the cards in each hand. My partner's dilemma was that her RHO opened 1 club and clubs was her suit. She had either five or six. She had opening points. I cannot remember where the points were in her hand. She had a little more than minimum opening count as I recall. What is the best way to handle this?

#### JEFF KROLLS ANSWER:

The general rule is when they bid your suit, you pass in tempo (don't let everybody at the table know they bid your suit). If Lefty should pass, partner is expected to balance (When the opponents will declare if you pass as partner has already passed on their contract, then you are in the balancing seat.)

As balancer, if you have 8 or more points borrow a King. Partner may have more than she's shown, so you bid as if your hand had 3 more points. That's called borrowing a king. So, your 8+ point hand is bid as an 11+ point hand.

If the partner has a 5+ card suit with 8+ points, she should bid it. If partner has a decent 4 card suit and shortness in one of the other 3 unbid suits, she should bid it—otherwise, partner doubles (takeout).

If partner doubles and you think you can set them scoring more points than you would if your side declares, you should convert partner's takeout double to a penalty double. Otherwise, bid something. You might bid notrump if you don't have a second suit. You might also bid your minor suit if you have 5+ of them as Righty is likely to have only 4 or even a 3 bagger. Michaels is no longer on as you didn't use it on your first bid.

Penalty doubles should work 2/3 of the time. If yours work more than that, you are not doubling enough.


Your other choices on your first bid after Righty bids your suit are:

1. If you have a second suit worth overcalling with; Bid it. This is often the case when Righty bids a minor and you have one of the majors.

2. Bid notrump. This is especially useful if Righty bids your minor and you have notrump points and no major. Stops Lefty from bidding 1 of their major.

### 2 Beginner Games - Results and Video by Robert Hanly's Durham DBC

Every week Robert Hanley of the Durham DBC takes two hands from his beginner games and shows how he would have bid and played the hand. Please note that he uses a BBO screen to show his solution so be aware of the positions in BBO, they may or may not match the hand record. This month's example is from his Dec 28th game.



### Hand 3- NT vs Trump Game?


The question is how to play your hand when you have two 5 card majors with good texture but only 6 HCP. Then he shows how he made a 4S contract.

How the players did:



Hand 10 - Evaluating Partners and Opponents hands while bidding and the Importance of the Lead.

The question in bidding revolves around encouraging your partner's rebid of diamonds. Whether or not you win your 3NT contract comes down to what S leads. If South leads a heart you go down and if they lead a club you make the contract.
