

Page 34 - Difference between Match Points and IMPs.
At match points - maximize your tricks. At IMPs - make your contract. 1st column - lose a trick to Lefty in diamonds then finesse after seeing Lefty has all 4 diamonds

2nd & 3rd column - std play is to lead low to the Ace then back to the Q to guard against a bad split. If the contract is aggressive this is how it should be played at either IMPs or Match points.

Page 37 Problem 1 - Falk didn't open an aceless 12 count, Lusky used the rule of 15 to pass out the hand for a good result.

Page 38 Problem 2, West's hand improves when East shows clubs and spades.

Page 38 Problem 4, 3NT is a superior contract to 4H despite the 4-4 fit

P. 38 Problem 5, the 2D bid shows 5H, so the 3H bid is a cue bid.

P. 38 Problem 6, Lusky / Falk 2D auction.

P. 39 Problem 7 - new suit by opener is nonforcing

Page 40 Problem 1 - Negative inference, no support
double by South denies 3 hearts

Page 42 - Problem 3 - Lawrence, Equal Level Conversion
ELC. Doubles clubs with hearts & spades &
not a big hand.

Page 45 - Schafel, cash a high trump in the hand with
2 high trumps, not the hand with one. Keep
the finesse in order. Saving a low trump
as an entry.

Page 46 - Itelms - pass when they bid four suit, look
to convert a reopening double to penalty.
Bid a decent 5 card suit to reopen
you don't need to reopen with a double.

Page 47 - Berg - Doubling, then bidding 1NT shows 19-20 points.

Page 49 - Harrington - 2 level overcalls are at least near openers

Page 51 - Elder - monitoring a board isn't correct when
ruling on an infraction.

Page 52 - Kantar - play the AK in your long suit to maximize
your chance of dropping the Queen. Then finesse
in your short suit if it doesn't work

Page 55 - Boehm - play a minor honor & keep dummy's
honor trapped

Page 60 - Lawrence 1D-2NT shows 16-12 points sometimes,
others play it 10-12. It's not 13+.
